




I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing.

Introduction

My son Joshua is getting married in January, and it's been fun to watch him and his fiancée prepare for the wedding. There are so many decisions to be made! They've had to think through the details of the ceremony, the venue, the flowers, the menu, the dress, and much, much more. But one of the most important pieces of the process is preparing and sending the invitation.

The invitation announces the joyful event and lets people know that they are meant to be included in the festivities. It tells the guests when the wedding is, where it is, and how to get there. And if they follow the instructions on the invitation, they'll experience the beauty and the joy of the wedding.

In much the same way, God has prepared an amazing experience for us – life in his kingdom. It is a life of greater joy, meaning, and fulfillment than anything else the world has to offer. And he is inviting us to be a part of it. But just as a guest can only experience the joy of the wedding if they read and respond to the wedding invitation, we can only experience the joy of life in his kingdom if we respond to his gracious invitation!

We do this first by making an initial decision to leave our old lives behind and follow Jesus into the new life he has for us. And if you haven't made that decision, I'd love to encourage you to make it today! But after we make that initial decision, we continue to affirm that decision by choosing to "respond to God's invitation." And one of the key ways we do that is by regularly spending time with him through Scripture and prayer.

That's the reason we've put this guidebook together: we want to encourage and resource you to deepen your relationship with Jesus by spending time with him in Scripture and prayer. And as you "remain in Jesus as he remains in you," (John 15:5) we look forward to celebrating the fruit that results through the power of the Holy Spirit!



How to Use This Guide

Each daily entry in this guide contains an opening Call to Worship, a Psalm of the day, a Scripture passage to read and meditate on, a couple of questions to think about, and an opportunity to talk with God (pray) about what you've read and heard. Here are a few thoughts to keep in mind:

- We've designed these devotions to be flexible. If a daily devotion is a new experience for you, you might want to start by setting aside ten minutes a day to go through the material and pray. Don't worry too much about the length of time it's better to spend a few minutes each day than to spend an hour every once in a while. And as time goes by and you get more comfortable, you may even find yourself naturally wanting to spend a little longer on each devotion.
- If you miss a day, don't stress over it! Just pick up where you left off the next day. We've only given you five devotions per week, so you have a couple of extra "catch-up" days built into each week. And remember, this is meant to be a blessing, not a burden!
- Many people find that picking a specific time and place to have their devotion each
 day helps them stay consistent. Remember there's no "perfect" way to do this. Just
 find the time and place that works best for you where you can spend a few quiet,
 uninterrupted moments by yourself.
- Each day, you might want to follow a basic order like this:
 - o Take a moment to sit quietly, recognizing that God is with you and loves you completely.
 - o Begin by saying a short prayer. Share anything you need or want to say to God, welcome his Spirit into this moment, and ask him to speak to you through his Word.
 - o Prayerfully read the Psalm of the day, then go through the main Scripture reading. Make sure to take your time and read slowly. You might want to read the passage several times. As you read, ask yourself: What do I notice about the passage? How might God be speaking to me today through these words?



- o Spend a few moments reflecting on and answering the questions listed. Many people find it helpful to jot down a few of their thoughts about the questions in the space provided. Taking a few notes has a way of helping us clarify what we're thinking, and it will also help you remember your experience better so you can share it with others.
- o Close by spending a few moments in prayer, submitting yourself to God and asking him to make you more like Jesus. If you like, you can write out some or all of your prayer in the space provided.

A Few Details

The Scripture readings included in this guide have been intentionally selected to complement the topics we'll be covering in the Sunday sermons and our Grow Group sessions. Each week, we focus on a particular theme that we'll explore more fully in the worship service that weekend. By reflecting on the theme throughout the week, you'll put yourself in a great position to hear from the Holy Spirit in worship on Sunday.

As you look through the readings, you'll notice that some days we give you a longer passage to read, but then we specify a few verses to focus on. On these days, we're including the longer reading to give you context, but encouraging you to focus specifically on the few verses that the questions will be based on. We suggest that you read the entire passage once, then read the verses to focus on several times. Note that you may read the longer passage several different days, while the verses to focus on will change each day. This gives you extended time to soak in a longer passage, concentrating on a bit at a time each day.

A Final Word

I'd love to invite you to keep one thing in mind as you go through this book. You aren't doing this to earn brownie points with God or to impress your friends! :) God already loves you fully and completely. Spending time with him in Scripture and prayer doesn't make him love you any more, and missing a day won't make him love you any less. That isn't the point!



The point is that *because* God loves you, he wants to spend time with you. And because a dynamic, transformative relationship with Jesus is the best possible thing for us, investing in that relationship is an opportunity, not an obligation.

So please, don't view this resource as a guilt trip, a duty, or a way to "be a good person." View it instead as an invitation to experience the beauty, joy, and transforming power of spending time with our loving and gracious King.

May God bless you as you "abide in the vine"!






